

FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK



I have found myself for the last 4 weeks dealing with a lot of grief personally and professionally. Personally, dealing with the memorial service for my stepmother and the loss of two church members. Professionally the loss of those two beloved church members and the loss of a community member who is also important to our church family. As a profession I am trained and educated in how to lead in those times of grief but personally we all grieve, even for those we don't know well.

I see the hurt. I see it in a whole lot of people, they may not realize what it is, but I recognize that sort of pain. It's the sort of pain that makes you mad at the world. Usually, that sort of pain is caused by loss. A profound grief that we struggle to name. In struggling to name that grief, we fail to give it room at the table. When we ignore that grief, it grows louder. It tries to gain our attention. It just wants to be heard. That sort of pain is difficult to contain. It eats away at the individual, and then—slowly but surely—at anyone either unfortunate or bold enough to enter that pain's trajectory.

When I come to those moments with others in their grief, I think about a God who heads toward our hurt. A God who has always been familiar with our pain and felt compelled to show it to us so that we'd stop imagining a God who is insensitive to what we're going through. We've inherited a world that is largely known by a hurt we don't know what to do with. We just know we don't want to experience it. But eventually, hurt comes for us all. We all experience loss. We know what grief is.

Maybe you're like me and you can spot the hurt from a mile away. You don't want to subject yourself to that, because you've already felt it (at least) one too many times. But the crazy thing about God, is that God knowingly enters that hurt with us. God sits in the middle of our hurt with us. God weeps with us. And, in so doing, God lifts the weary head. And in those moments I remember that I am still in the process of being transformed and healed from that hurt, myself. And it just might be that God is calling me to enter someone else's pain with them, so that they can know about the God who heads toward their hurt too.
